

The Seacrest Teaching Fellows program is comprised of faculty who propose project(s) to research a teaching-related topic or explore a teaching innovation that can be adapted across multiple courses. The program cultivates exceptional teaching by assisting faculty as they seek to ignite students' passion for learning and provide high quality learning experiences. Fellows will share their findings with other instructors to further develop a culture of teaching excellence within the College of Business at Nebraska.

Membership Type:

- ☒ Teaching Fellow – Faculty propose new project(s) to conduct research on a topic of interest or implement a teaching innovation and evaluate its effectiveness. Teaching Fellows are eligible for financial support of \$6,000 per year for up to two years per project.
- ☐ Senior Teaching Fellow – Teaching Fellows who have completed two years in the program may move into a mentorship role. They are still eligible for continued financial support of \$7,000 per year for up to two additional years while continuing their research and innovation in teaching, which should lead to publications in teaching journals or presentations at teaching conferences. Following four years of participation in the Teaching Fellows Program, Fellows are eligible to continue participating and mentoring but must take one year off from financial support every four years.
